

Church in Chains shares points for prayer through World Mission Partnership, to help Irish Methodists pray for the persecuted church.

#### WDR PARTNER: KING GEORGE VI CENTRE

KGVI, located in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, provides rehabilitation and boarding facilities for nearly 300 students with physical disabilities and those who are deaf; as well as many without a disability. Students range from 3 to 20years-old and many are orphans or come from low-income families. In a country where having a disability can carry great stigma and exclude people from opportunities open to others, KGVI helps the young people gain skills for life so that they have a much greater chance of finding their niche and contributing to society and enjoying life. Their motto is "Never Give Up".

World Development & Relief

Through World Development & Relief, Irish Methodists walk alongside thirteen long-term development partners to see transformation in this world as, together, we tackle global poverty.

MCI's development work addresses issues around water, agriculture, vocational training, healthcare, education and rights. Partners are active in Ghana, Zimbabwe, South Africa, Lebanon, Nepal, Palestine, Philippines, Zambia, Bangladesh and Honduras.



### **JANUARY: SOLITUDE & SILENCE**

Loving Father, I intentionally place myself alone in your presence and recognise that you are closer than my own breathing. Help me to stay here long enough that this becomes a formative place where your Spirit has the time and space to do deep work away from others who would watch, judge or interpret what I say. Allow me to wait until I know you are the only one watching me and I can discern between your voice and the voices of the world. Give me courage to notice the things I would rather not notice or feel, and Jesus, lead me on a pilgrimage of deepening responsiveness to your control of my life and being. Loosen my rootedness in the world and plant me by streams of living water. Amen.

### **DECEMBER: SERVICE & GENEROSITY**

Lord Jesus, you have shown us the dignity of service in the Kingdom of God and revealed that in serving others we so often meet with you. We confess that we would rather suffer great cost to do grand things for you, than experience the many little deaths of going beyond ourselves, which then rest contentedly in hiddenness. Holy Spirit, assist us to find in THIS day OUR opportunities to serve others in acts that uncover the generosity of Jesus' gentle and humble heart. Amen.

#### **FEBRUARY: SIMPLICITY**

Lord God, you know our tendency both to hold onto the clutter of tradition, but also to rush from one 'new' thing to the next. Give us grace to relinquish the disorder which accumulation brings to body, mind and spirit, and to embrace the opportunity to fix our unbending focus on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith. Holy Spirit assist us to create margin, space and openness in our lives, churches and communities. Lord Jesus, help us to find our identity in you and to set aside competitors for our devotion. Amen.















### **MARCH: FASTING**

Father, and giver of every perfect gift, as I consider a period of fasting, help me to discern what to fast from which will best enable this to be a time of growth, renewal and healing. One of your fruit, Holy Spirit, is self-control; may you produce that in me, together with patience and peace. Strengthen me in the times when my fast is most difficult. You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power! Jesus, as we worship you, may the good we adore enter our minds and hearts to increase our faith. You have invited us to be nourished and strengthened with heavenly food. Reign at the centre of our lives and our Church, by the transforming power of your Spirit. Amen.

### MAY: COMMUNITY & CELEBRATION

Gracious God, deliver us from the easy habit of thinking that our spirituality is something between you and each of us alone. It is so hard to admit that our spiritual wholeness cannot be reached outside of our life with others. Jesus, help us to open our hearts and spirits to what you want to say to us in this day. Allow us to see you as the One who gave himself totally, completely, absolutely, and unconditionally for others. Help us to commit our relationships to you, that they may become channels of your grace in our church fellowships and that, in your Spirit's power, we may become channels of your grace for the people of our community and our world. 
